

P: Now is the time of God's favor; **C: now is the day of salvation.**


P: Turn us again, O God of our salvation,C: that the light of Your face may shine on us.






A Reading of the Small Catechism: The Apostles' Creed – the 2nd Article




L Help, save, comfort, and defend us, gra - cious Lord.
